



If you were to hop into your time machine and pay a visit to St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Williamsville in the early 1920's, you would have found this book in the pews. It was published by the United Lutheran Church in America in 1918 the same year the ULCA, as it was called, came into existence as the result of a merger of the General Synod, the General Synod— South, and the General Council, three earlier bodies of Lutherans that had existed seperately for doctrinal reasons, or because of the civil war. They were United now, and a spirit of Optimism was present as Lutheranism overcame the stigma of being a German-speaking Church at a time when our country was at war with Germany. This new service book in English, would carry Lutherans into the post-war era. It was a sturdy book, not replaced until 1958 when the Service Book and Hymnal (or the "red book" as it was known) came out.

On February 17th, as part of our celebration of 150 years of life, we are gooing to present this liturgy to you for worship that day. Others, from the congregation's past will make an appearance that day, too, to reminisce, or share a thought or two. For that reason, there will be only ONE SERVICE OF WORSHIP AT 9:00AM on that day. If you want to enter into the spirit of the day, you are invited to dress in vintage clothing.

Actually we're making an entire weekend celebration, for the multimedia presentation on the history of the Church together with our pot-luck meal, which had to be cancelled because of the snow and cold, will be rescheduled for SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 16. The presentation will be at 4pm, followed by the potluck. We both hope that you will sign up for Saturday and show up on Sunday to enjoy the 150 years of life God has given us.


PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE

In the East African country of Tanzania, 61% of the population is Christian. But the offshore island of Zanzibar is almost entirely Muslim. Nevertheless, there is a Lutheran church there. Anglicans, Catholics and Lutherans work on the island in the mainly tourist economy. Sectarian violence is not unknown, but the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania plays a large role in maintaining harmony. One ministry on Zanzibar sews apparel with Christian and Muslim women working side by side; the Zanzibar Interfaith Centre offers workshops in interfaith dialogue; an interfaith soccer team begins each game with both Christian and Muslim prayers. Local peace committees bolster amicable relations at times of stress or transition, such as during elections, by offering seminars, and by communicating with candidates, police officers and government officials.

The Tanzanian tradition of tolerance emphasizes taking time to understand the "other." It is a lesson that Christians on Zanzibar, who are a very small minority, can share with Muslims in the US and Europe, where they are the minority.

The ELCA funds a variety of the Tanzanian Lutheran national and regional ministries. There are also 20 ELCA synods that have companion synod relationships with Tanzania. **YOU** are part of this partnership, through your Mission Support. *Thank you!*
